Dear Friends,

We are fortunate to have a loyal and growing base of support. I am pleased to announce the Major Gift Initiative, a campaign in support of the renovations of the Family Care Center and soon the Heart and Vascular Institute, has exceeded the \$3M goal with \$3,777,000 raised. Gifts came from all sectors of the community – trustees, physicians, employees, residents, and private foundations; in all sizes to make this renovation a reality. Your support is evidence that you want your community hospital to continue to grow and invest in new technology.



New Jersey newspapers have been awash with headlines on Governor Corzine's budget cuts. Schools, pensions, parks and hospitals are on the list. New Jersey hospitals are required to treat everyone, turning no one away. Formulas for reimbursement have been realigned and Chilton will lose the majority of its charity care reimbursement. Chilton had been receiving \$500,000 annually for the over \$3 million dollars in care given each year. In July, \$250,000 will go away. Chilton is one of the third of NJ hospitals that will lose the majority of their reimbursement.

Chilton is quite sound financially, but the reductions come at a time when we are investing \$19 million in infrastructure and equipment. We continue our complete replacement of the HVAC system, and floor-by-floor renovations. In this issue you will read about a trustee, Rocco Barbieri, who helped steer Chilton into financial stability during his tenure as Chairman of the Board. You'll meet another couple who have planned for their future and ours.

We hope to see you at one of our events or tours. In the meantime, enjoy a safe and healthy summer.

CHILTON THRIVES UNDER COUPLE'S LEADERSHIP & GENEROSITY

Gloria and Rocco Barbieri met at Paterson Central High School, where both launched careers as well as a lifetime partnership. While their school tenure was limited, their commitment to bettering the future of our communities has endured decades. Mr. and Mrs. Barbieri are still inspiring others through their charitable leadership. In fact, here at Chilton Memorial Hospital, the Barbieris are truly in a class of their own.

Twenty-eight year residents of Franklin Lakes, Gloria and Rocco Barbieri have long considered Chilton their hometown hospital. It was a place where they grew their family and frequented for various medical needs until 1996, when Mr. Barbieri was invited to join Chilton

Memorial Hospital's Board of Trustees. And then this community hospital evolved into a passionate cause. For well over a decade, Chilton Memorial Hospital has benefited from the couple's extraordinary kindness and resolve to build Chilton's reputation as a regional health care leader.

Mr. Barbieri has served on the hospital Board since 1993, recently completing three years as Chairman. Under his stewardship, Chilton attained numerous milestones and great achievement, including its ranking among the top 5% of stroke care centers nationwide and the implementation of a complete facility modernization project. Of most significance, Mr. Barbieri guided



Chilton through a fiscal reorganization and into the black. "The hospital has sustained a profitable operating margin for several years, despite the challenges of government regulations, cuts in charity care funding and declining reimbursement," stated Mr. Barbieri. "It is important for Chilton to continue operating in a profitable mode so it can continue to offer new services and deliver expert health care to the community."

Mr. Barbieri also served a term on the Chilton Memorial Hospital Foundation Board, leading the recent "Major Gifts Campaign" to its \$3 million goal. His longtime relationship with Mario Rosellini, Foundation Chairman, strengthened ties between the two governing boards, facilitating communication and collaboration on behalf of the hospital. "Rocco never missed a

Board meeting, or an opportunity to integrate our efforts toward common goals," said Mr. Rosellini.

Mrs. Barbieri has been a terrific friend to the Foundation as well. In 2006, she co-chaired the organization's annual donor appreciation event and has consistently offered support to the Foundation's various fundraising initiatives.

Prior to retirement, both Mr. and Mrs. Barbieri enjoyed rewarding professions. Following his graduation from Villanova University, Mr. Barbieri spent three years as a high school math teacher before joining PricewaterhouseCoopers and becoming a certified public accountant. A diverse and distinguished career ensued, highlighted by his roles as Controller for Baker Industries, Inc., Chief Financial Officer/Trustee for Guardsmark, Chief Financial Officer and co-owner of General Felt Industries, and President of 21 Holdings.

Mrs. Barbieri earned her Bachelor of Arts from College of St. Elizabeth and a Masters Degree in Education from Columbia University before teaching business classes at Paterson Central and later Wayne Valley High School. Although she took time off to raise her children, Mrs. Barbieri devoted more than 20 years to New Jersey's public schools.

"If you are successful in life, there comes a point when you have to give back to the community and get involved," asserted Mr. Barbieri.

one may find them taking part in a health screening or enjoying some of the various workshops, classes and social activities offered throughout the year.

As loyal hospital benefactors, the Eckhardts are members of the Chilton Memorial Hospital Foundation's President's Club and New Century Society. The couple has established four charitable gift annuities to benefit Chilton, which allows them to donate to the hospital in exchange for fixed payments that are issued for the rest of their lives, providing a supplementary income.
